The programme began on an emotional note as the students expressed their heartfelt gratitude and admiration for Mr. Thaper. They thanked him for being a kind, compassionate, and approachable mentor who had always guided them with patience and wisdom. Students fondly recalled his thought-provoking anecdotes during the morning assemblies, which made learning enjoyable and meaningful. They also appreciated his motivational YouTube videos, describing them as a constant source of inspiration and guidance.
